Secondary Assistance Scheme

Financial Assistance is available to guardians during **Term 1** to holders of the following cards:

- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card
- Pensioner's Concession Card
- Centrelink Health Care Card

The allowance is in two components:

- **\$ 235.00 Education Program Allowance**
This is paid directly to the Centre to support the payment of subject costs.
- **\$ 115.00 Clothing Allowance**
This can be paid either to the parent/guardian or directly to the school.

Applications must be made in person at reception. You must present your concession card to complete the application. Applications must be made annually.

The card must:

- Be valid for at least 4 weeks and valid during Term 1.
- Have the name of the student listed on it.
- Not be expired at the time of application.

What is the Saver Plus programme?

Glossary of Terms

Below is an explanation of the terminology used when referring to contributions and charges.

Charges

Any costs for which payment is compulsory - all Year 11, 12 & 13 costs are charges.

Voluntary Contributions (Year 10 only)

A voluntary payment requested from parents towards the cost of materials, services and facilities used by Year 10 students in the Centre's educational program.

Extra Cost Optional Components

Voluntary courses and activities where the parent or student elects to participate.

These include:

- Optional courses which have a high cost associated with their provision
- Optional activities for which there is a high cost associated with their provision, e.g. excursions, incursions etc.
- Other optional school-based activities which address broad learning outcomes and for which there is a high cost, such as the school ball, graduation, reward excursions, leavers shirts etc.

Participation in Extra Cost Optional Components is voluntary, but a charge is payable if families opt for the student to participate.
